IMP - what is it and why is it important?

An Iwi Management Plan (IMP) is a document developed by iwi to express their values, tikanga, and priorities when it comes to managing natural resources and the environment. It reflects the voices of whānau, hapū, and iwi, and sets out how we want to protect and care for our taiao now and for future generations.

For Ngāti Apa ki te Rā Tō, our IMP is important because it:

- Affirms our rangatiratanga and kaitiakitanga over te taiao and taonga
- A living document for our iwi on how to manage our natural and physical resources within our rohe
- Helps councils and other agencies understand and respond to our aspirations and responsibilities as tangata whenua
- Addresses key environmental issues and important to Ngāti Apa ki te Rā Tō
- Supports the intergenerational wellbeing of our people and our whenua.

Developing our IMP ensures that our mātauranga, tikanga, and priorities are heard, respected, and embedded in how the environment is managed in our rohe.

Nominations are called for the election of one (1) Pūaha Te Rangi and two (2) Tarakaipa Trustees to represent the Pūaha Te Rangi and Tarakaipa hapū on the Ngāti Apa ki te Rā Tō Trust and the Ngāti Apa ki te Rā Tō Charitable Trust. The highest polling candidates will be appointed to both trusts for a three-year term. Nominations close at 5pm on Friday, July 11, 2025.

PLEASE NOTE, NOMINEES MUST:

- · Be 18 years of age or older.
- Be a registered member of Ngāti Apa ki te Rā Tō (applications to register may be completed at www.ngatiapakiterato.iwi.nz).
- Submit nominations in writing, signed by the nominee and not less than one (1) adult registered member of Ngāti Apa ki te Rā To.
- · Undergo a Police vetting process.
- Whakapapa to the Hapū the candidate will be standing for.
